

Coming from I-95

Exit I-95 at 135th Street. On 135th Street go east for 2.9-3.0 miles to the Florida East Coast Railroad tracks. Immediately after crossing the railroad tracks, turn right (south) onto Arch Creek Road. Continue on Arch Creek Road for about 0.1 mile (two blocks or so) and look for the entrance to the ACSCC Clubhouse grounds on the left (east) side of the road. The clubhouse is off the road in the trees.

Coming from Biscayne Boulevard

Turn west at 135th Street. Unfortunately, a pavement divider prevents you from turning left, just before the F.E.C.R.R. tracks, directly onto Arch Creek Road. Instead, continue west on 135th Street to N.E. 16th Avenue (first stoplight) and turn left (south). Proceed a short distance (a few blocks) to the F.E.C.R.R. tracks. Immediately after crossing the tracks, turn left (north) onto Arch Creek Road. Follow Arch Creek Road about a half mile, to the club entrance, on the right (east) side of the road. The clubhouse is off the road in the trees

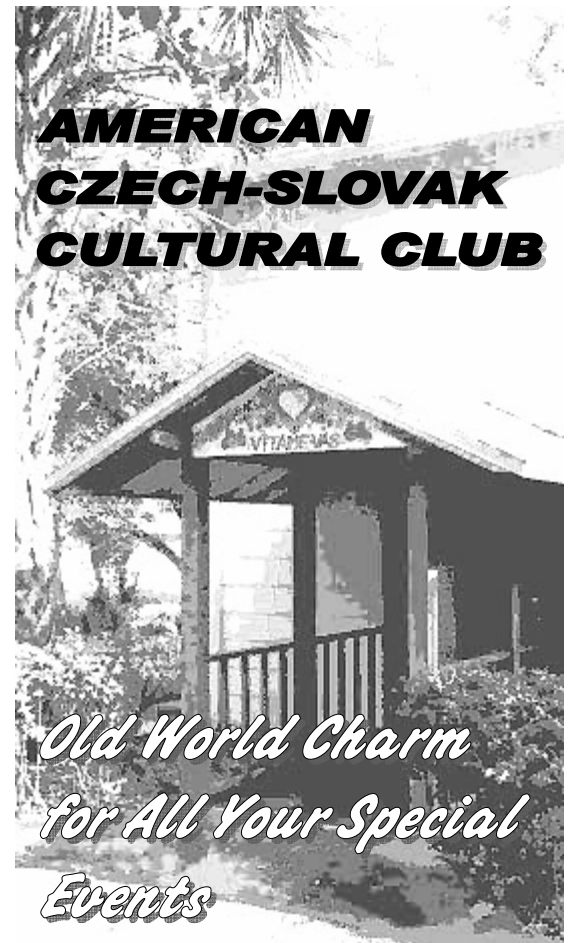
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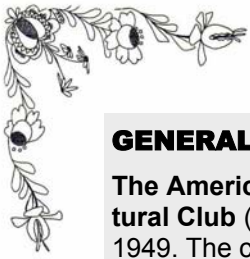

GENERAL

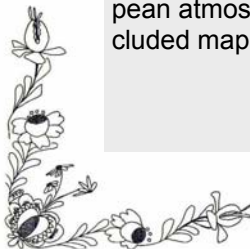
The American Czech-Slovak Cultural Club (ACSCC) was founded in 1949. The clubhouse is located on 3.5 pristine tropical acres adjoining Arch Creek, in North Miami, Florida. The purpose of ACSCC is to further the Czech and Slovak cultures, customs and traditions in South Florida

The restaurant featuring Czech and Slovak food is open for dinner every Sunday from noon to 5:00 PM . Featured entrees are roast duck, roast loin of pork, and roast chicken plus, at least, one special entree of the day. Sunday specials can be found on the club website at acsc.org. All dinners include soup, salad, entree, coffee/tea and homemade dessert. Diners have a choice of Czech dumplings or potatoes, and sauerkraut or a vegetable.

The bar is open from noon to 10 PM on Sunday, and serves a variety of distinctive Czech and Slovak beers plus wines, coolers, imported mineral water as well as soft drinks.

Traditional Czech and Slovak recorded music is played every Sunday afternoon. Live music is provided many times during the winter season.

The public is welcome to visit the Club on any Sunday afternoon to enjoy good food and drink in an Old European atmosphere. Please see the included map for directions.



RENTAL

The historic clubhouse seats up to 193 guests with a large dining room decorated in authentic old European charm. Tables and chairs are available on-site for all events. A fully equipped kitchen can accommodate large and small dining needs. There is a hardwood dance floor and space for a live band or disco.

The lovely 3.5 acre waterfront grounds can be used for outside events. The grounds include several large tropically shaded areas that would be ideal for outdoor weddings and other special events.

The ACSCC bar is a charming place to socialize before, during and after any special event.
